Our three-year-old preschoolers are cruising into the second half of our school year! We meet on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 9:00 - 11:30. What a fun group! We are learning to share and take turns, as well as use our words and problem solve. Friendships are forming and it's such a joy to see!

Our students are practicing writing their names, and using scissors, as well as getting elbow-deep into paint, playdough, and the rice in our sensory table. January brings us snowy themes, including wintery stories, finger-plays, puffy-paint snowmen, cutting circles, and corn-starch "snow."

Pre-K:

The minds of four and five-year-old children are truly like sponges! These boys and girls amaze us daily! We meet on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, from 8:30 - 11:30, or from 8:30 - 2:50 if you choose full days. This group of children has learned kindness and compassion. They play together so well and are truly concerned for one another. It is so beautiful to hear their prayer intentions. Not only do they pray for their families, but will often pray for one another, especially if a friend is absent.

Pre-literacy skills are abundant in our class! We are learning letters, practicing beginning sounds, writing journals, making class books, and learning to follow multi-step directions. We are also learning math concepts through practicing numbers, building, counting, patterning, and using terms like biggest and smallest.

Mostly, we are having so much fun! The best learning happens through hands-on play and interaction. Heading into the second semester, we look forward to lots of wintery fun. We will continue to grow our brains and our hearts!

Our preschoolers are such a blessing to our school! Mrs. Freeman and I are so grateful to be able to teach and love these children. We both are moms to college-aged children, and it seems like yesterday that our own were this age! 
