## IMMACULATE CONCEPTION PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES SEPTEMBER 3, 2013

Meeting opened with a prayer from Father at 7:15 PM.

Minutes from June 4, 2013 approved.

## Father Joe's Report:

- As of August 1, Fr. Stephen Rooney is the pastor of Our Lady on the River Parish, and Fr. Robert Slaton is associate pastor. This means July 31 was my last day serving as administrator there, though I am still on the Cardinal Mooney High School Board.
- Our parish festival made a profit of approximately \$42,141 roughly \$13,500 below the budgeted figure though we don't have a final figure, as there are still a few outstanding bills. Ellen Vernier has informed us that she won't be able to return as general chairperson, so we'll be looking for a replacement; we're grateful to Ellen for all her time and hard work over the last few years.
- During the summer some school parents approached me regarding some concerns about the school, so I held a special meeting for parents on July 30, attended by the superintendent of schools for the Archdiocese. About 66 parents were there, and a variety of subjects were discussed. Last week I met with Mrs. Steele and the teachers to discuss how we can address these concerns and also improve what we think is already a very good school. School begins tomorrow with a half-day; on Thursday, the first full day, a letter from me will go home to all school families explaining what we're doing to resolve the issues and concerns that were raised. Our enrollment for the coming year stands at 130 for K-8 (an average of just over 16 students per grade), and 151 counting preschool (down from last year).
- As you heard at Mass this past weekend, we are still about \$14,000 short of reaching our CSA target of \$72,276; only 19% of our parishioners have pledged or contributed so far. We knew this would be a difficult year for CSA because of the overlap with "Changing Lives Together" (and we're not the only parish with this problem). Last year we reached our CSA target, but it took until March ten months into the campaign before we did so. Therefore, we budgeted for a certain shortage, but we still want to close the gap as much as possible. Because we have to make up any shortfall from our operating budget, we'll continue stressing the importance of the CSA throughout the coming months.
- In regard to "Changing Lives Together", we've received 338 pledges or contributions, which equates to 24.4% of our registered parishioners. The pledges and contributions total \$486,306 86.9% of our target. This is a respectable amount in terms of other Wave Five parishes like ours; our figures are higher than some parishes', and lower than others. The campaign was in recess during the CSA and the summer, but will resume in the near future.
- The first goal of our "Changing Lives Together" campaign is the repainting of the church interior. As I explained in my bulletin column of August 18, we've discovered that the temporary repairs done to the church roof were most unsatisfactory, and the issue of further possible leaking problems has to be addressed first. The Long-Term Planning Committee is investigating our options specifically, whether further repairs are possible, or whether it makes more sense to replace the roof at this time. (Even is repairs are a realistic option, the roof probably has about five more years before it needs to be replaced.) As soon as this has been determined, a recommendation will be presented to the Finance Council and to the

Archdiocese – for archdiocesan regulations require the parish finance be consulted, and written permission from the Archbishop be obtained, for any project or repair costing between \$10,000 and \$100,000. If it weren't for the roof, the church interior would likely already have been painted. Our goal now is to have the roof repaired in October or November, and to have the church interior repainted in time for Christmas – at which time the statues of St. Anne and the child Mary, and the Sacred Heart of Jesus, will be returned to their permanent position on the pedestals above the northwest and northeast doors.

- We're very pleased with our new maintenance garage, and have heard a number of favorable comments, including from the festival workers who ran the concessions stands there. An anonymous donor has offered to pay the cost of the asphalt work that needs to be done around the building, and we're hoping to have this project completed in the near future.
- As you know, we have a new director of Faith Formation, Mrs. Tina Kovalcik, who was introduced at all the Masses two weekends ago. Jane Mount is now serving exclusively as pastoral associate, and when she fully retires in one or two years, Tina will absorb that responsibility.
- Catechetical Sunday is technically September 15, but we will observe it the following Sunday, with a special commissioning ceremony for the year's catechists at the 10 AM Mass on Sunday, September 22.
- I will be attending the bi-annual Priests' Convocation at Boyne Highlands from the evening of Sunday, September 22 through Thursday, September 26; instead of daily Mass, there will be Communion Services that Monday through Thursday.
- The right-to-life organization Imago Dei will hold its annual baby bottle fundraiser here for one month, beginning in mid October; parishioners will be invited to take home a baby bottle, fill it with their loose change over the next month, and return it to church.
- As explained in my bulletin column, our parish will be conducting the Christlife program. This is a form of parish renewal intended to help parishioners come to a deeper relationship with Jesus; the three seven-week sessions are titled "Discovering Christ," "Following Christ," and "Sharing Christ." Each session will consist of a meal or refreshments (depending on whether it's offered in the morning, afternoon, or evening), a prayer service, an instructional video, and time for small group discussion; there will also be a Saturday retreat part-way through each series. Many volunteers will be needed to assist us. We plan to begin in January; an information and planning meeting for possible volunteers will be held next Monday, Sept. 9, at 7 PM.
- St. Mary Queen of Creation Parish will be replacing its church roof next week, making it unavailable for Mass. Their weekday Mass will be held in their parish hall, but if a funeral comes in, it will be held in our church, if available. (When Fr. Nick Zukowski called me to make this request, I readily agreed since I'll be making the same request of him when the work on our church is underway.)

I.C. will be sponsoring a Protecting God's Children seminar on Saturday, October 26<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 am to 12:00 noon in the Parish Hall.

**Youth Ministry:** On April 15<sup>th</sup> the youth group visited Faith Formation and enjoyed a meeting with the 8<sup>th</sup> graders in small groups.
