IMMACULATE CONCEPTION PARISH COUNCIL MINUTES APRIL 2, 2013

Meeting opened with a prayer from Father Joe at 7:30 PM.

Minutes from March 5, 2013 approved by consensus.

Father Joe's Report:

As I announced at the weekend Masses, our "Changing Lives Together" campaign is off to a good start. As of Friday, we've received 252 pledges and donations coming to a little over \$404,000 – about 72% of our target (though only about 55% of what we'll need to raise in order to include the gymnasium project). About 18% of our registered parishioners have taken part so far, with an average gift of about \$1600. We will have some sort of follow-up to contact those we haven't heard from.

- The CSA will be getting underway at the end of the month, with the Archbishop's annual CSA homily being played the weekend of April 27-28.
- The Holy Week liturgies were fairly well-attended, with about 150 persons at the Liturgy of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, and about 125 in attendance on Good Friday. I had a total of 74 confessions during Holy Week a rather small number for a parish this size. The Easter Vigil was very well-attended, primarily because of the large RCIA group this year; we had 8 baptisms, 4 persons received into the Church, and 7 other persons confirmed. Special acknowledgment and thanks are due to Jane Mount for her work with this year's RCIA group, to her and Deacon Ken for helping the Easter Vigil go smoothly, and to Pat Austin and the choir and musicians for the beautiful music.
- This coming weekend, for the Feast of Divine Mercy, I'll be having a short homily, to allow time for the praying of the Divine Mercy Chaplet during Mass. The Divine Mercy Prayer Service itself will be held from 2-3:30 PM Sunday.
- Author and alleged visionary John Leary will be speaking here on Sunday, April 14th, beginning around 1:30 PM in Church.
- One of our office secretaries will be leaving us in a few weeks to accept a fulltime position elsewhere. We've advertised the opening in the parish bulletin, and have received over 10 expressions of interest; interviews begin this week.
- The Blue Water Vicariate will again have "Traveling Masses" this year, in which people from other parishes are invited to come to a particular church on a given Sunday. We will host such a Mass in October; the date has yet to be determined.
- Along with the rest of the Church, we thank God for the gift of Pope Francis, and extend to him our support and prayers.

Call to Order / Opening Prayer

Meeting was called to order at 7:15 pm

Fr. Joe led the group in an opening prayer

Meeting Minutes from March 19th meeting where reviewed by all and approved with corrections.

Ron V. reviewed the evening's agenda

Garage Update:

- Demo is complete
- During Demo a 2nd gas line was discovered. The gas company will reroute it for the new meter after the footings & pad is completed.
- Foundation work to be started after 5/4/13 due to First Communion Masses.

Church Painting Restoration Update:

- The current painting estimates were reviewed.
- Floor under pews also needs restoration. Quotes were also reviewed, the pews will need to be removed to sand & finish.
- All painting & church work to be carefully coordinated with church schedules including festival & weddings.
- George presented (3) bids for review and comment. Much discussion over Faux (Foe).
- Open discussion on keeping the marble look on the columns with further discussion required.
- Contractor Detroit Spectrum (DPS) is to be contacted to clarify their bid for both inside & outside painting. DSP listed an option to the church columns & would mock one up for review & approval prior to work. LTP to also have DSP quote a sealant coating on exterior north wall.
- Father discussed the moving back of the communion rail on St. Joseph's side to make it useful. Father presented a cut sheet showing 8" wide kneeling pad x 15'-0" long to be installed. 2 are required.
- Repairs done by the insurance companies contract was reviewed:
 - Workmanship poor quality
 - o Corrective action on the leak was not successful. Water is still getting into church.
 - Dennis C. to send George an inspection document to be used to further pursue the repairs from the insurance claim & their contractor.

Roof was installed 1994 and must be added to the long term plan for replacing.

Dennis C. to get an estimate on the roof replacement.

Further discussion is required to consider repair or replacement of the roof at this time.

Roof issues are to be corrected prior to church restoration.

Changing Lives Together Update:

- To date there is 314 donation card turned in with pledges of \$469,000.
- There is approx. \$40,000 already sent in.

Campus Security:

- Bob D. to presented estimates and campus plan locations for both camera locations & motion sensor
- The estimates must include the parish office in the prices.
- Father would like a small safe installed in the rectory for Sunday collection for safety. He has taken them alone to the parish office during inclement weather.

Parish Concerns:

- Communication between committees, councils, commissions should be more consistent between them.
- LTP currently reports to Finance Council.
- Finance Council should be represented at Parish council and provide an Un-Approved copy of the LTP meeting minutes.

Gymnasium Update:

- Drill weep holes in block (On Hold)
- Add drain tiles around building (On hold)

School Entrances:

- On Hold until Church plans are completed.
- Jeff W. to get with Thompson Phelan Group (TPG) to discuss new entrance renderings.
- Jeff W. to meet with Mrs. Steele & the School Advisory Board to present their ideas for renovating.
- LTP to start to look for budgetary numbers to cover the side entrances were the student's line up.

Cemetery:

- Bob D. presented a map which shows the current occupancy level we will exceed capacity in 30 years.
- Property north of the cemetery is for sale.
- Further discussion is needed on the expansion of the cemetery into adjacent properties.

Father Joe would like an overhang or awning over the parish office door.
