Meeting opened with a prayer at 7:17 pm.

Minutes of the February meeting were approved with no changes.

#### **PASTOR'S REPORT:**

- At yesterday's Presbyteral Council meeting, a report was given on the newly revamped CSA, which has been in effect for almost a year now. The Archdiocese of Detroit still raises more in this type of collection than any other diocese in the country (including those larger than Detroit), and last year the amount of the average gift increased but the rate of participation continues to fall; this is a concern the AOD is continuing to address. On-line giving has increased greatly, plus the average on-line gift is higher than the average gift given in the more traditional manner. (This is important because the majority of Generation Y and Generation Z *only* give on-line.)
- The figures have been sent out to each of the BWV parishes regarding next year's school support plan. I.C. will be donating \$30,4690 and getting back \$39,509.
- In regard to a possible capital campaign to benefit Catholic education, a report was given at yesterday's Presbyteral Council meeting. As noted on the summary sheet, all the pastors have been interviewed, along with many lay leaders. There is support for some sort of capital campaign, but a strong sense that more preparation needs to be done before it occurs. The final decision as to whether to conduct such a campaign hasn't been made yet; this will likely occur this summer or fall. If a campaign takes place, two things are definitely known: there will be a direct tie-in with the New Evangelization (growing out of Synod 16 and the pastoral letter), and all parishes will have to support Catholic education in some manner.

- As announced a few weeks ago, the loose change collection for the time being will be applied to purchasing a
  new, industrial-strength vacuum cleaner for the church, and then a new refrigerator (which will go to the parish
  hall and allow the one currently there to be transferred to the maintenance garage).
- The school's open house (held Sunday February 25) was well-attended and may have resulted in several new school families next year.
- Our students did well in the annual Academic Olympics held the previous day at St. Augustine in Richmond.
- The school's Science Fair will be held on Thursday March 15.
- This past Saturday the PTC held the art auction called "Picasso's Playground" for the second time; it seems to have been successful.
- The school strategic planning process is continuing; the committee held another meeting last night.
- Confirmation interviews are taking place. This year's Confirmation class has 47 8<sup>th</sup> grade students (from school and Faith Formation); Bishop Battersby will preside at the ceremony on Friday April 20.
- As you've heard, our parish has purchased a subscription to *FORMED*; information on how to access it for free has been printed in the bulletin.
- Instead of giving out a book from Dynamic Catholic as an Easter gift this year, we are looking instead at doing something which informs our parishioners (especially the twice-a-year Catholics) about *FORMED*.

#### **FINANCE COUNCIL** – Bob Tharrett reporting – minutes attached.

- CSA report on goal vs pledges from the AOD.
- Report on the special tuition meeting held February 6, 2018.
- The AOD's audit of our cemetery finances has been completed; all the figures have been reconciled or confirmed to the satisfaction of the Archdiocese.
- A special meeting was held a week ago to listen to a presentation by the CEO of the Catholic Foundation, which was established a year ago to assist persons wishing to make large gifts or bequests to parishes or to other Catholic institutions. One of the things the Foundation focuses on is helping parishes establish their own endowments for various purposes. The Finance Council is considering whether it would be advantageous for us to create one or more endowments for designated purposes; this would be appealing to parishioners wanting to make a legacy gift (that is, one that won't be spent right away, but will continue to benefit the parish for years to come). The Finance Council is continuing to explore this possibility.

**Worship Commission** – Fr. Joe and Mary Kot reporting – minutes attached.

- The old chasubles have been cleaned and repaired and stored in the rectory.
- The planning for Holy Week and Easter is complete. One benefit we'll have this year is that Deacon Larry
  will be available to assist us throughout the week (and he is planning on singing the Exsultet at the Easter
  Vigil).
- Deacon Larry is also assisting with the Friday evening Stations of the Cross; he and I are alternating from week to week.
- Two experiences of the Stations of the Cross have been scheduled for the school students.

- Our next Mass of Reparation will be on Monday March 19 the feast of St. Joseph.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

Our CSA target for the coming year will be \$85,174 – an increase of \$2,440 from last year, and the second-highest quota we've ever had. However, we shouldn't have any trouble meeting it, since we exceeded last year's quota (\$82,734) by almost \$40,000. (Some of that money was given instead of Christmas donations, so as to lower the overall figure used in calculating our CSA.) This year's CSA begins the weekend of May 5-6.

CSA last year the CSA was revamped to make the formula more equitable going forward. In 1982 almost 50% of all households contributed to CSA, that has now declined.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

Security – Not too much new to say about the church, Clay township police will be attending our Easter Masses.

Police officers have come and given security recommendations for the school in light of the security conference the staff attended.

All of the teachers and parish staff took part in A.L.I.C.E. training (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) provided by St. Clair County Sheriff's office.

The school will be holding drills on more situations, more than just fire and tornado.

#### **OPEN FORUM:**

The plaque that was dedicated to Fr. Paul, our former pastor, has been found and hung in the school.

Cleaning bill for the vestments presented to the K of C. Hopefully will be covered by the group.
