### Meeting opened with a prayer at 7:16 PM

Minutes of the October 7, 2014 meeting were approved with one correction. Pat McGrath's term was listed incorrectly in the attendance area; It should be "Term 1, Year 3".

### **PASTOR'S REPORT:**

- All of us congratulate Nicole Tomaszycki and her husband Mike on the birth of their son Ryan.
- Each October the Archdiocese asks all parishes to take a headcount at the weekend Masses on two consecutive weekends (see attached). We had the ushers do this on October 25 and 26, November 1 and 2. There are several things to note. Our overall attendance was up about 100 people from last year (reverse side). Also, on October 25 and 26, the numbers were distorted somewhat because (a) the Michigan Michigan State football game was occurring on Saturday (possibly affecting attendance at the 4:30 pm Mass); (b) the Lions' game began at 9:30 am (possibly increasing attendance at the 8 am Mass); and (c) the enrollment ceremony for children preparing for Reconciliation and Eucharist was held at the 12 noon Mass (definitely increasing attendance that day). Of the two weekends, November 1 and 2 was definitely the more typical in terms of attendance.
- We have received notification from MDOT (Michigan Department of Transportation) of formal guidelines for the hanging of banners across M-29; the main point is that a permit has to be issued by the local township. The festival committee and other affected groups are being notified.
- The Dueling Pianos event, held on Saturday October 11, was a limited success; it didn't raise more than a few hundred dollars, but it was enthusiastically received. If it's repeated, the thought is that we'll need to raise ticket prices at least a bit.
- The Little Way Ladies Society sponsored a Trunk-or-Treat last Saturday (Halloween Night); because of cold, rainy weather, the entire event was held in the parish hall, though attendance was limited. If it's repeated next year, an evening other than Halloween itself may be chosen.

- Catholic Charities of Southeast Michigan (CCSEM) was formed in 2013 by combining the five semi-independent
  county-based Catholic Social Services. It's now the primary agency for the Archdiocese of Detroit for performing
  the corporal works of mercy, including adoption services, foster care, mental and behavioral health counseling,
  Hispanic outreach, immigration and refugee services, senior services, Project Hope (for pregnant women), and
  other emergency services. A collection for CCSEM will be taken on the weekend of November 22 and 23
  (replacing the former collection for the Campaign for Human Development).
- As part of an ongoing evaluation of the Catholic Service Appeal (CSA), the Archdiocese e-mailed a brief
  anonymous survey to randomly selected Catholics throughout the diocese on October 31. The input will be used
  by a CSA study group charged with making recommendations to the Archbishop.
- We will be hosting a special exhibit and presentation on the Shroud of Turin here at Immaculate Conception on Monday February 2. More information will be given closer to that date.

### FINANCE COUNCIL: - Fr. Joe reported - minutes provided at the time of the meeting.

- Finance council reviewed parish financial reports.
- Approval of purchase and installation of ceiling fans in the school gym to help circulate air.
- Finance Council met this past Tuesday, minutes to follow.

- The induction ceremony for the National Junior Honor Society was held at the school Mass this past Friday (Halloween). Ten students (one 8<sup>th</sup> grader, nine 7<sup>th</sup> graders) were officially inducted.
- At all the Masses this past weekend, the participants in the ChristLife process were officially recognized
  and commissioned (following the conclusion of the program with a retreat held this past Saturday). We
  will begin the ChristLife process once again this coming January, and we're hoping many more
  parishioners will choose to take part.
- The Memorial Mass for All Souls' Day was held last night, Monday November 3 (since All Souls' Day itself fell on a Sunday this year). Approximately 80 persons were present; with many of them coming forward to light a candle in memory of a deceased loved one. Most of the participants came over to the parish hall for the reception which followed. Information was also given on the special presentation we'll be hosting next week on coping with grief during the holidays.
- The Book of Life will be on display in church throughout the month of November; many parishioners have already written in the names of deceased loved ones.
- Our next Mass of Reparation will be held on Monday November 17 at 7 pm.
- The Mass on Thanksgiving Day (Thursday November 27) will be at 9 am.
- The Rite of Admission for those taking part in the catechumenate process will be on the First Sunday of Advent, November 30, during the 10 am Mass.

### FR. JOE'S REPORT

- The induction ceremony for the National Junior Honor Society was held at the school Mass this past Friday; ten students were officially inducted.
- At all the Masses this past weekend, the participants in the Christlife process were officially recognized and commissioned (following the retreat this past Saturday which concluded the program). We will begin Christlife again in January.
- The Memorial Mass for All Souls' Day was held on Monday night (because All Souls' Day itself fell on Sunday). Approximately 80 persons were present, with many of them coming forward to light a candle in memory of a deceased loved one. Most of the participants afterwards came over to the reception. Information was given on the special presentation we'll be hosting next Wednesday on coping with grief during the holidays.
- The Book of Life will be on display in church throughout November; many parishioners have already written in the names of deceased loved ones.
- Our next Mass of Reparation will be held on Monday, November 17 at 7 pm; the 8<sup>th</sup> graders from Faith Formation will be attending (so I will slightly alter the format of the Mass).
- The Mass on Thanksgiving Day (Thursday, November 27) will be at 9 am.
- The Rite of Admission for those taking part in this year's catechumenate will be held on the First Sunday of Advent: November 30 at the 10 am Mass.
- The Archdiocese has prepared a format for a Liturgy of the Word in emergency situations—that is, when it's discovered at almost the last minute that no priest is available for Mass. Our parish staff has held a rehearsal, so they're familiar with what to do if that situation arises.
- At the request of several parishioners, we are now holding Eucharistic Adoration on the first Tuesday evening of each month, from the end of the 6:30 pm Mass until Benediction at 9 pm (benefiting those who cannot come on First Fridays).
- There will be three vicariate communal penance services in Advent: at St. Mary Queen of Creation on Thursday Dec. 11 at 7 pm; at Our Lady on the River (Holy Cross) on Wednesday Dec. 10; and at Holy Trinity (St. Stephen) on Saturday Dec. 13.
- We will be hosting an exhibit and presentation on the Shroud of Turin on Monday, February 2, 2015.
- Each October the Archdiocese asks all parishes to take a headcount at all the Masses on two consecutive weekends. (Sheets were distributed with our parish results).
- Fr. Joe's column for Sunday, November 16, will provide some liturgical education (sheets distributed).

### **REPORTS & UPDATES**

Music: Inserts being placed inside hymnals to pray for priests, deacons, and consecrated religious.

**Art & Environment:** This ministry is hoping to keep the peace lilies presently in the altar area thriving until next Easter. Focusing toward more white and gold for Christmas, with less red. December 14 is Gaudete Sunday; the liturgical color for that day is rose which will be present in the altar and table cloths and flower arrangements. Carole shared something that is read at a church in Georgia before Mass starts that she thought could be used at IC, and although it was nice the concensus was that it was too lengthy to be read before every Mass at *our* church.

**Sacristans:** Some of the sacristans have been trained as Eucharistic Ministers of Holy Communion to fill in if and when needed.

**Ushers:** Mike will personally take up the issue mentioned in the minutes of our last meeting about the 10 am ushers not paying close enough attention to seating the late-comers. He will prepare a list of bullet-points for the ushers as a reminder of their duties. It was mentioned that the ushers should not be shaking hands with the congregation at communion time but it becomes awkward for them when parishioners extend their hands. He is trying to find a way to address this issue.

### High School Youth Ministry (SHINE) Report

- -In October we averaged 28 teens at regular meetings. We are happy with that number, our group is growing and thriving.
- -In October we had 11 new teen Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion trained. They will be participating at the scheduled SHINE noon masses in the upcoming Months.
- -We have 6 new teen Lectors in the process of being trained now. They will also be participating at the scheduled SHINE noon masses in the upcoming months.
- -On October 25th our Parish hosted Called to Serve. We were happy with the turn out. 15 teens attended, 11 of which were from SHINE.

- -We had our first SHINE noon Mass on October. 21 of our active members came to share in community. We were very happy with the turn out.

A FORMATIONAL MEETING IS SCHEDULED FOR TUESDAY, DECEMBER 9 AT 7:30 PM. THIS MEETING MAY BE CHANGED TO A CONFLICTING EVENT BEING HELD IN THE PARISH.

A SURVEY PREPARED BY THE ORGANIZATION, ST. PAUL STREET EVANGELIZATION, HAS BEEN DISTRIBUTED TO VARIOUS GROUPS OF THE PARISH. THE SURVEY AND ITS COVER LETTER IS ATTACHED. SOME EXAMPLES OF THE VARIOUS GROUPS SOLICITED ARE: PARISH COUNCIL, SHOOL PERSONNEL; I. C. STAFF, LECTORS, EXTRA ORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION. THE SURVEY WAS PRESENTED TO THE SCHOOL PERSONNEL AND I.C. STAFF WHO PARTICIPATED IN TH ESTAFF RETREAT HELD ON MONDAY, DECEMBER 1, 2014.

THE SURVEY IS DESIGNED TO IDENTIFY THE OBSTACLES TO THE NEW EVANGELIZATION THAT MAY EXIST AMONG THE MEMBERS OF A PARISH; OR, WITHIN THE ARCHDIOCESE AS A WHOLE. IT PRESENTS 14 BASIC STATEMENTS REGARDING EVANGELIZATION AND THE RESPONDENT IS ASKED TO INDICATE ON A SCALE FROM 1 TO 10 WHETHER THAT STATEMENT REPRESENTS AN IDEA, SENTIMENT THAT IS: (1) NOT AN OBSTACLE; OR (10) IS A SIGNIFICANT OBSTACLE. THE RESPONDENT MAY RATE THE STATEMENT BETWEEN 1 AND 10.

THERE ARE SPACES FOR OTHER OBSTACLES WHICH MAY BE IDENTIFIED BY THE RESPONDENT AS WELL.

ALSO, THE RESPONDENT MAY OFFER SUGGESTIONS FOR POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS TO THE OBSTACLES PRESSENTED. FOR EXAMPLE: THE OBSTACLE MAY BE IDENTIFIED AS: LACK OF HANDS ON TRAINING AND PRACTICE IN SHARING OUR FAITH. THE RECOMMENDED SOLUTION MAY BE OFFERING THE PROGRAM, CHRIST LIFE; OR, THE ST. PAUL STREET EVANGELIZATION PROGRAM TO THE PARISH.

THE REPSONSES WILL BE COMPILES AND COLLATED AND USED TO DETERMINE AS BEST AS IT CAN BE DETERMINED, THE MINDSET, ATTITUDE, THE UNDERSTANDING OF THE FAITH COMMUNITY OF IMMACULATE CONCEPTION. IT IS HOPES THAT THE RESULTS WILL BE FINALIZED BY THE 15<sup>TH.</sup> OF JANUARY, 2015. THE RESULTS WILL BE SHARED WITH FR. JOE ESPER AS WELL AS THE PARISH COUNCIL.
