Meeting opened with a prayer at 7:15 PM

Minutes of the September 3, 2013 were approved with no changes.

PASTORS REPORT:

- Fr. Joe reported that the Finance Council approved the recommendation of the Long Term Planning Committee to install a new roof on the church. The addition of slope(s) on the north end of the building and improved ventilation will be included and will eliminate current problems with the flat roof in that part of the building. Work is scheduled to begin the third week in October. Interior painting and repairs will take place after the installation of the roof is completed.
- The Finance Council also discussed the overall state of the parish finances which are presenting us with challenges. Further discussion and options will be discussed at the next meeting.
- Changing Lives Together will gear up again with an outreach this fall to those who have not yet participated.
- Faith Formation is beginning this week.
- IC hosted a special Mass of Reparation for the sins of our country which included a healing and anointing service on Monday, September 16th. Approximately 80 people were in attendance. We will be hosting another such Mass of Reparation on Monday, October 21 that will also include a healing service.
- Author and alleged visionary John Leary will be speaking here at Immaculate Conception on Sunday, October 20.
- Fr. Joe will be away at the annual Marian Conference on the weekend of October 26th and 27th. We will have a visiting priest who will speak on behalf of the Christian Foundation for Aging and Children.
- The parish campus has been experiencing some intermittent phone problems. The phone company is looking into the issue. We apologize for any inconvenience this has caused.

• At the recent Archdiocesan Priests' Convocation, Archbishop Vigneron announced a major initiative to implement the New Evangelization – that is an outreach to those who have been baptized, but who no longer practice their faith. This will be a major focus over the next few years. Bishop Michael Byrnes (our regional bishop) will head a committee to plan and implement this effort. More information will be forthcoming. Our parish is planning the Christ Life program which fits nicely into this initiative.

COMMISSION REPORTS:

Worship Commission - September meeting minutes attached

- Fifteen new altar servers have been trained and officially installed.
- The annual pet blessing for the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi will be held Friday, October 4th at 2:00 pm.
- The Archdiocese is asking every parish to take a head count at all the weekend Masses for two consecutive weeks; we will be having the ushers do this the next two weekends.
- After all Masses this weekend, October 5th and 6th, Fr. Joe will once again have a blessing of holy water, salt, and oil.
- November 1st the feast of All Saints, the Holy Day Masses will be at 9:00 am and 7:00 pm. Being First Friday, there will be the usual Eucharistic Adoration with Benediction at 2:30 pm.
- On Saturday, November 2, instead of the normal 9:00 am Mass for First Saturday, there will be an 11:00 am Memorial Mass for all those who've died over the past year. Invitations will be send out to the relatives of such parishioners.

Christian Service Commission – No written report

No report from Christian Service. Their next meeting is Tuesday, October 8, 2013.

Education Commission – April and June meeting minutes attached

- The Education Commission held a meeting and spent some time getting to know Tina Kovalcik our new DRE.
- A survey is being developed for education that will take place after the Changing Lives Together initiative
- Looking into the possibility of hosting Natural Family Planning classes as there are none available in the Blue Water Vicariate at this time.

Long Term Planning (LTP) - August minutes attached

• LTP has recommended replacement of the church roof with some improvements made to the sloping and ventilation to prevent future problems. The current roof has only 5 years of recommended life remaining, so it is a good time to replace it. A special meeting was held, bids were reviewed, and a recommendation was made to Finance Council. This recommendation was approved. Work should begin in October.

VICARIATE PASTORAL COUNCIL (VPC) – September minutes attached

- Deacon Tim Maxwell is working with Fr. Brian, Fr. Joe Horn, and Pastor Tom Seppo to improve the ongoing problems with the prison ministry within the Blue Water Vicariate.
- There will be a Youth Ministers conference on November 20th in Novi.
- Our Lady of Guadalupe will be hosting a Mexican Dinner.
- A Vicariate wide healing Mass will be held November 8th at St. Stephen Church at Holy Trinity Parish from 7:00 pm to 10:00 pm. All are welcome.

Deacon Ken was informed at the VPC meeting that as clergy, he was not supposed to be the representative for Immaculate Conception Parish. Parish Council member Kathleen Grimm has volunteered to be our representative. We are still in need of another representative as they recommend two from each parish.

They are available at \$1 per booklet. This represents a savings over past years. It was agreed by council to purchase this book. Parish Council members will provide a free will donation at the next meeting in November to help defray the cost to the parish, making this a gift not only from the parish, but from the parish council as
- Fr. Joe presented a letter he received from Deacon John Lucas at Amate House. One of our young adults, Mary Cornwell, is living for the year in the McKinley Park Neighborhood in Chicago working with youth. They are asking for our help to sponsor her work. We will have a bulletin insert (provided by Amate House) and we will discuss the option of having SHINE help out, perhaps with a bake sale or other fund raiser.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Suggested changes have been made for the Operational Procedures manual. Unfortunately they were not available for parish council members to look at at this meeting. They will be posted on the parish council web site so they can be reviewed before the next meeting. The draft procedures and suggested changes are both available on the private area of the iccatholic.org web site.
- Former Council member Pam Mertes and Christian Service Representative JoAnn Augustine had previously agreed to work on a Volunteer Appreciation Dinner. They are looking at possibly hosting it in January of 2014. They will need to discuss this with George Eichorn, Business Manager, to establish a reasonable budget for this event.

WORSHIP COMMISSION MEETING MINUTES October 24, 2013

Minutes of September 12, 2013 approved with two corrections: Pg 1, PP 4, correct spelling of *Archdiocesan*; Pg 1, PP 4, 10/20 Sunday John Leary, insert the word *alleged* to read "his *alleged* revelations".

FR. JOE'S REPORT:

The new roof currently being installed will take approximately 15 working days and will involve the building of a pitched roof on the flat portions to hopefully eliminate the moisture and mold problems of the past. Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday daily Masses will be held in the parish hall during this time.

Repainting of the church interior scheduled to begin on Monday, November 4, and will include necessary repairs. All daily Masses will be held in the parish hall. Scaffolding will be dismantled for the weekend Masses in the church. Funerals will be scheduled for Saturdays or be held at St. Mary Queen of Creation during this period.

Head count of attendance at Masses the first two weekends of October was done per request of the AOD (*sheets distributed*), and any future adjustments to our Mass schedule could be based on the data obtained.

Masses of Reparation for the Sins of Our Nation are being held at various sites throughout the country on the third Monday of each month. At the two we held here at IC, about 80 attended in September and 65 in October, which included a healing service and Sacrament of Reconciliation.

A vicariate healing service will be held on Friday, November 8, at St. Stephen in Port Huron beginning at 6:15 pm, confessions, healing service (including Anointing), Benediction, and the availability of prayer teams until 10 pm.

A visiting priest will be speaking at all the Masses this weekend on behalf of the Christian Foundation for Children and the Aging.

Fifteen new altar servers have been trained and officially installed.

Friday, November 1, Feast of All Saints, Masses at 9 am and 7 pm. Being it will be a First Friday, there will be Eucharistic Adoration after morning Mass until Benediction at 2:30 pm.

Saturday, November 2, Feast of All Souls, there will be the annual Memorial Mass in honor of this past year's deceased parishioners.

We are tentatively scheduled to host the "Vicariate Traveling Mass" at 12 noon on Sunday, November 17th. (though there has been some confusion about this).

Special collection envelopes have been ordered for use by our boys and girls in school and faith formation; these to arrive in time for Advent.

At the priest's convocation last month, Archbishop Vigneron announced a major initiative to implement the New Evangelization here in the Archdiocese of Detroit .

Bishop Michael Byrnes (our regional bishop) will head a committee to plan and implement this effort. Two of the specific elements will be a year of prayer and fasting, and a synod (possibly in 2016) intended to change the culture in the Archdiocese. It is obvious our parish's implementation of the *Christlife* program will be a timely and appropriate preparation for this New Evangelization initiative.

Christlife—a program of parish renewal which we'll be undertaking—will begin in January. There will be seven consecutive weeks of sessions, with the program being offered on Thursday mornings and Thursday evenings. A short video about *Christlife* will be shown at all the Masses on the weekend of December 14-15.

Fr. Joe explained the above topics in detail and there was some discussion about them as we went along.

REPORTS & UPDATES

MUSIC: Pat announced there was a nice increase in members in the Youth Choir from 4 to 8; could use a few new ones in the Adult and Bell Choirs. Looking ahead to Lent, it was decided to eliminate the processional hymn in favor of silence, and during Lent at weekday Masses there would be no recorded music, the hymns would be sung a cappella.

ART & ENVIRONMENT: Carole plans to add something each week to the autumn décor in church. However, with the repainting of the church the decorations will be removed but she would still like to do something for the weekend Masses. Banners with names of our deceased parishioners of this past year will be hung for All Soul's Day, November 2. New hangings for the Lenten season have been made for the church but Carole would like to use the previously used ones in the school during Lent, as well as Advent material for the Advent season for added interest.

Carole brought to our attention the problem of mold in the church basement where she has her workspace and storage area, during snow and rainy spells there is flooding. Since there is no other space available for her, there is a need for a back-up battery for the sump pump or a generator. Mike will look into the situation and Mr. Bob will be contacted to work out this problem.

LITURGICAL MINISTRIES: No report.

SACRISTANS: Ted Stawiasz, our newest sacristan, is officially on the schedule beginning the first Sunday in November.

USHERS: Mike announced nine ushers went through the CPR and AED (defibrillator) training in conjunction with heart associate trainer Kathleen Grimm.

ALTAR LINENS: New altar cloths and matching linens are ready for use when the church repainting is finished.

LOVING HANDS: All is going well.
